7. When large crowds gathered, Jesus taught that the poor and lowly as well as those who are godly will be blessed. 5:1-10

8. Jesus sent out the twelve disciples to the lost sheep of Israel to preach that the kingdom of heaven is near and to heal the sick. 10:1-8

e. Jesus is condemned by the current shepherds and leaders of Israel because they are blind guides and hypocrites.

1. Pharisees condemn the disciples of Jesus for picking heads of grain on the Sabbath and condemn Jesus for healing on the Sabbath, but Jesus declares that he is the Lord of the Sabbath and declares that they have condemned the innocent. 12:1-8

2. In response to the Pharisees request for a miraculous sign, Jesus declares that a wicked generation asks for a miraculous sign. 12:38-42

3. Jesus reacts to the accusation that the disciples break the tradition of the elders made by the Pharisees and teachers of the law by saying that they break the command of God for the sake of their tradition. 15:1-9

4. In reply to the disciples remark that the Pharisees were offended at his words, Jesus calls them blind guides. 15:10-14

5. Jesus tells the disciples to be on their guard against the teaching of the Pharisees and Sadducees. 16:5-12

6. Jesus questions the Pharisees about how David can call the Christ Lord, if he is also his son but no one could say a word. 22:41-46

7. Jesus pronounces woe on the Pharisees and the teachers of the law saying that they are proud hypocrites who are blind guides who neglect justice mercy and faithfulness. 23:1-36

8. The Sadducees question Jesus in regards to marriage and the resurrection but Jesus declares that they are in error because they don't know the scriptures or the power of God. 22:23-33

9. The Pharisees question Jesus about the greatest commandment and whether or not they should pay taxes to Caesar and when Jesus answers them they are amazed. 22:15-22

10. Jesus declares that he is the Christ, the Son of God and the high priest Caiaphas condemns Jesus as worthy of death saying that he had committed blasphemy. 26:62-64

11. The chief priests devise a plan with the Roman soldiers so that they were to say that his disciples came during the night and stole Jesus. 28:11-13
